

Parts of Canada are really beautiful. Another way to say that is that Canada successfully stole a bunch of really beautiful land, and now we live on it. That doesn't make Canada a good thing.



Some Canadians are really nice people. That makes sense because not all settlers are even aware of the genocidal project that they are a part of. They're not all malicious, evil people, but they are all a part of a really ugly thing. That thing is Canada, and you should hate it.

Canada is stolen land.

Much of it, including almost all of the province of British Columbia, was never ceded in any treaty.

Existing treaties were often won through coercion, violence, threats and deception by colonists.


Those treaties are constantly being violated by settlers and the Canadian state.

Aboriginal people now make up just 4% of the population of Canada, but they represent almost 1/4 the prison population.


They are also disproportionately targeted by other agents of the state like the police and child services.

Only 0.2% of the land mass of Canada is recognized as native land through the reserve system.

When you think of Canada and slavery you might think of the Underground Railroad, and of escaped African slaves coming North to Canada for a safe haven. White Canadian nationalists love to talk about that because the idea that Canada is less racist than the United States is one of their favourite myths.

White settlers in what became Canada had slaves. No slave ships landed here, but African slaves were bought, stolen or captured in other colonies and brought North where they could be traded, bought and sold. There were also many Indigenous slaves captured by French or British colonists or acquired through trade with Indigenous nations that practiced slavery.

Slavery existed here before white contact and settlement but increased a lot under British and especially French influence. There were more than 4000 slaves in British North America before slavery was officially abolished in 1834, about 2/3 Aborigina and 1/3 Black.

Many of the women who campaigned for women to become legal persons and for their right to vote also campaigned in favour of eugenics.



Emily Murphy spent more years of her life fighting (successfully) for an act that would cause more than 3000 poor, mentally ill, Indigenous or racialized women to be sterilized without consent in Alberta than she did fighting the famous "persons case."

She has a statue on parliament hill, a commemorative stamp in her honour, and a glowing biography in elementary school textbooks across the country.

CANADA IS REALLY BAD FOR THE ENVIRONMENT.

Before European settlement, Southern Ontario was 80% covered with forests. Now it's less than 20%.

The Alberta oil sands, backed by the Canadian government, take up more land than any other mine in the world and will soon become North America's largest source of greenhouse gases.

75% of mining companies worldwide are headquarted in Canada. Canadian mining companies are responsible for environmental destruction, conflict and suffering around the world.

In 1993, 2 Canadian "peacekeepers" beat a Somali teenager to death while at least 20 others watched or listened.

Canadian soldiers had been ordered to shoot suspected thieves near their camps.

They also fired shots into a crowd approaching a Red Cross aid centre.

When Somalis gathered to protest these actions, Canadian soldiers fired on the crowd, killing some and injuring many others.



This is just one Canadian military operation. Canadian troops have been active in imperialist wars around the world since the creation of the Canadian Forces.

Canadian history is a history of racist exclusion, not openness.

In 1908, the Canadian government passed an Asian Exclusion Act that said that immigrants must come directly from their country of origin, with no stopover. The law made it impossible for Asians, especially Indians to come, as it was not possible to sail directly to Canada with no stopover.

Un 1914, a ship called the Komagatu Maru arrived in Vancouver, having sailed from China with 376 Indians aboard. The leaders of the mission threatened insurrection in India if the passengers were not admitted to Canada as British subjects.

White British Columbians protested against the admission of the migrants, and they were officially refused food and water for the two months that they sat in the port of Vancouver. Eventually the ship sailed back to India, where it was met by a British gunboat. Gunfire broke out and 19 passengers were killed.

Aboriginal and Metis people fought many uprisings and rebellions against Canadian expansion West in the 19th century. Canada built a railroad, created a new military/police force (the RCMP), executed leaders and killed thousands of people to make sure they were unsuccessful.



In 1990, Mohawks near Oka, Quebec stood up against plans to build a golf course and subdivision on top of their traditional burial grounds. Canada sent in police and military troops to try to stop them.

Hundreds of migrants are in jail in Canada at any given time, awaiting or fighting deportation. They can be jailed for days, months or years with no charge or trial.

Canada deported almost 200 people to Iraq and Afghanistan between 2004 and 2014, as well as 138 to Syria and 26 to Gaza and the West Bank. Canada is complicit in racist wars abroad, and yet it refuses to let in those affected at home.

Canada is an ongoing project, and the Canadian state depends on the faith and support of Canadians to survive.



That's why the government spends so much money on seemingly symbolic things like statues and monuments, ceremonies, fireworks, flags, festivals, advertising, and "educational" programs.

Right now, the Canadian state is getting ready to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Canadian confederation. We know that that's more than 150 years of stolen land, misery and death.

Instead of staring uncomfortably as the parade marches by, let's intervene in their party. Let's find ways to organize with our friends or communities and show them that we know they're liars, that Canada is nothing to celebrate, and that not everyone is buying in to their bullshit.
